

## **UMH WORLD SHOW SPECIAL AWARDS**

### **Ace of Spades Challenge Award**

Eddie and Rebecca Monhollon's stallion, Ace of Spades, distinguished himself as a champion in both Under Saddle and Conformation classes. Ace of Spades is a Double Platinum AGMH Hall of Fame member, inducted in 2008. In his honor, the Monhollon's have created a special Challenge trophy to be awarded to any horse achieving all of the following each year for 2 consecutive years

Winner of UMH World Grand Championship Under Saddle

### **Al Prewitt Memorial Challenge Trophy**

The Al Prewitt Memorial Award honors a very well respected horseman, known to many mountain horse lovers. The winner of the Ladies Classic Class will take home a trophy created with the likeness of Al Prewitt and one of his beloved mountain horses. This trophy is retired to any Lady who wins the Ladies Classic Class in 3 consecutive years.

### **Amateur Versatility Award**

The amateur versatility award was first presented in 2006. Amateur riders compete in amateur trail obstacle, amateur conformation, amateur western, amateur under saddle classes, pro-am classes and the water glass class. The same horse is not required in each class. The rider attaining the highest number of cumulative points is the winner.

### **Barb's Stormy Knight Award**

This award was first presented at the 2008 UMH World Show. Don and Nancy Copland, owners of Barb's Stormy Knight, have enjoyed watching their horse excel over the years with professional, amateur, juvenile, and novice riders. In 2007, Stormy was inducted into the AGMH Hall of Fame as a Double Platinum member for points accumulated in both under saddle and versatility classes. In honor of his many achievements over the years, Don and Nancy decided to sponsor this award. Points accumulate from amateur under saddle classes, open under saddle classes, open trail obstacle competition, and open western classes. The same rider/handler is not required in all classes.

### **Judges' Choice Award**

Every year as the judges' see the variety of horses entered at the World Show, one emerges as the horse that best represents what the judges' believe a mountain horse should be. Only one horse can claim this title each year. Every horse entered in at least 2 classes at the UMH World Show is entered into the competition for this award. No special entry form or fee is necessary. If your horse competes in at least 2 classes, it could be the winner of this award.

### **Natalie Wright UMH Equitation Challenge Trophy**

This award, created and sponsored by Wright Way Farm, honors the Youth Equitation accomplishments of Natalie Wright. The Challenge Trophy was first awarded in 2006 to Natalie for winning the UMH 2005 and 2006 Spring Premier, Kentucky State, and World Youth Equitation Classes. A trophy will be awarded to any youth who duplicates these achievements by winning the UMH Spring Premier Youth Equitation Class, the UMH Kentucky State Youth Equitation Class, and the UMH World Show Youth Equitation Class each year for 2 consecutive years.

### **Wilda Derickson World Equitation Challenge Trophy**

The Wilda Derickson World Equitation Trophy is presented to the UMH Youth World Champion Equitation winner each year. The trophy is sponsored and presented by Wilda Derickson, TWHBEA Adult Equitation World Grand Champion and instructor to many walking horse and mountain horse equitation champions. This award is retired to an individual who receives the honor for 3 consecutive years.

### **Youth Versatility Award**

Every year the youth versatility award is presented to an individual under the age of 18, who has exhibited their horsemanship in youth under saddle and western classes, trail obstacle competition, equitation and showmanship. The same horse is not required in each class. The rider attaining the highest number of cumulative points is the winner.

### **10th Annual Jr. Robinson Super Horse Award sponsored by Manna Pro and Ace of Spades Versatility Trophy**

Created in honor of Junior Robinson, the Junior Robinson Super Horse Award was first presented in 2001. Horses compete in age division trail obstacle, conformation, western and under saddle classes. Pro-am, driving, and open 4 gait classes count as well for this award. The same rider/handler is not required in all classes. The horse attaining the highest number of points in 5 classes is the winner. Juvenile, Novice, and Amateur Classes do not count toward this award. Since 2007, the winner of the Super Horse title has been presented with the Ace of Spades Versatility Trophy. This trophy is generously donated by Eddie and Rebecca Monhollon to honor their stallion, 2006 Junior Robinson Super Horse award recipient, Ace of Spades.
